Soft Skill	Description
Teamwork	Ability to work collaboratively in a team environment and effectively with people at all levels in an
	organization
Communication	Ability to communicate complex ideas effectively and confidently, both verbally and in writing
Leadership	Strong record of leadership in an academic, professional, or extracurricular setting
Empathy	Ability to understand and relate to clients
